2. Edinburgh Women in Data Science Workshop@Heriot-Watt University – Report

The first Women in Data Science Workshop took place at the Edinburgh Campus on May 15th. The objective was to share with the next generation, experiences and good practice of women working in data science. The venue was the Postgraduate Centre, and it ran in hybrid mode. Fourteen female speakers from academia and industry shared their experiences with students. A wide spectrum of topics and insights were shared, from healthcare and finance, through to data ethics and transitioning to a career in data science.
