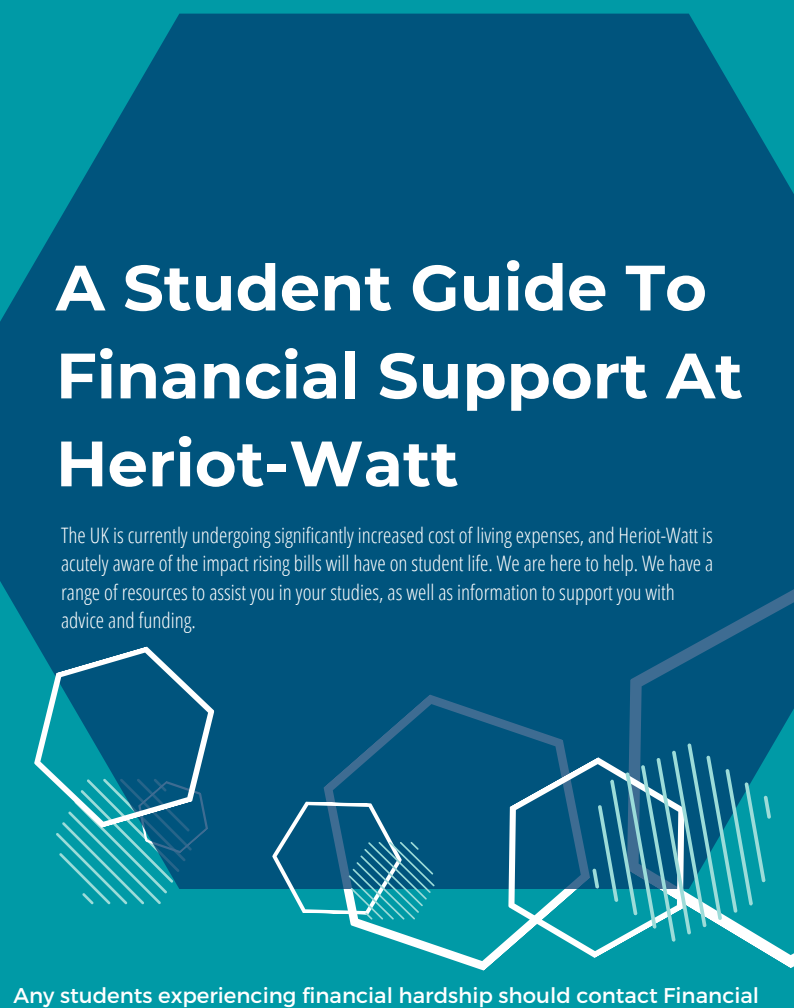

A Student Guide To Financial Support At Heriot-Watt

The UK is currently undergoing significantly increased cost of living expenses, and Heriot-Watt is acutely aware of the impact rising bills will have on student life. We are here to help. We have a range of resources to assist you in your studies, as well as information to support you with advice and funding.

Support Available to All Students

Hardship Fund



The University has funding available to assist students who are experiencing financial difficulty. Money is awarded for help with living costs (not tuition fees) and is paid as a grant.

Emergency Support



If you are in financial crisis you should contact student wellbeing and you can discuss your situation with a member of staff, who may be able to authorise a £50 next day payment, if appropriate.

Scholarships & Bursaries



All students looking for financial support should look carefully through the Scholarships page to see if there is any available bursary or scholarship you may be eligible to apply for.

De Lima Award



This Fund is to help Widening Participation students alleviate unfortunate circumstances including, health conditions (physical or mental), counselling, study equipment, accommodation, food, situational crisis help, etc.

Care Experienced Students



If eligible for SAAS students can apply for the Care Experienced Bursary. They may also be eligible for the Care Experienced Accommodation Grant over the summer months to help with certain types of accommodation costs.

Estranged Students



If eligible for SAAS, students can receive support as an independent student. This usually means that you'll be entitled to the maximum Independent Student Bursary (ISB) and student loan for living costs.

Widening Access Support

Heriot-Watt is committed to helping students reach their full potential and welcome people from all backgrounds. We want to make your journey through university as easy as possible and offer additional support to certain student groups to support you with this. Childcare Fund



If you are a full-time home student, funded by any UK government, you can apply for assistance to help towards the cost of formal childcare.

Access Bursary



Eligible students from widening participation backgrounds can apply for the access bursary (min £1000 per year of study), this must be done before studies commence.

HWU Expenses Bursary



For some students the cost of attending university can be overwhelming. To help with this we are offering eligible students a bursary to cover costs.
