

Upskilling Scotland Scholarship - Application Terms and Conditions

1. All information detailing how to apply for the scholarship forms part of these terms and conditions. Submission of an application will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
2. This scholarship is not open to existing Heriot-Watt University students.
3. To be eligible to apply to the scholarship scheme, applicants should:
 - Reside in Scotland or work in Scotland.
 - Fully complete the scholarship application form and submit it with a copy of a Council Tax Bill, driver's license or redacted payslip
 - Submit their application by midnight **24 July 2021**.
4. There are 120 funded Construction and Infrastructure courses, 200 funded Business courses and 200 Digital courses available.
5. Applications will be considered, and courses allocated in the date order in which fully completed applications have been received. Priority will also be given to those in furlough or in redundancy situations.
6. Upon allocation of the funded courses, any remaining applicants will be informed that their application has been unsuccessful.
7. The successful applicants shall receive ONE Master's level course from a choice of:

Construction and Infrastructure courses: Sustainability for Construction Professionals; Climate Change, Sustainability and Adaptation; Data Analysis and Simulation; Learning from Disasters; Value and Risk Management;

Business courses: Developing Successful Projects; Developing & Executing Strategy; Economics for Business; Financial Decision Making; Leadership Theory & Practice; People Work & Organisations; Strategic Marketing.

Digital courses: Digital Leadership; Operations Management; Strategies for Managing Supply Chains.
8. Should the successful applicant on wish to sit an examination in their Master's level course, please contact egis-idl-enquiries@hw.ac.uk (construction and infrastructure courses) or eps.scholarships@hw.ac.uk (business and digital courses) prior to the exam registration deadline. The examination fee is covered by the scholarship.
9. Students on the construction and infrastructure have up to six exam sittings (approx. two years) to sit an exam from date of enrolment. They will either have up to 31 December 2022 or to 31 May 2023 to complete their course depending on their start date. Access to the course materials will be withdrawn at this point.
10. No time limit applies to students studying the business and digital d courses.
11. Successful applicants agree to be named, photographed, interviewed and quoted and their verbal and or written testimonials used in publicity for Heriot-Watt University or Edinburgh Business School.

11. A maximum of 10 employees per company are eligible for the scholarship unless agreed otherwise with Heriot-Watt University.
