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1. Introduction and context

- 1.1 To help us to meet our legal requirements under the Equality Act 2010 we are publishing a range of student data linked to the protected characteristics of our student population.
- **1.2** This publication is an update on student information published in April 2021 covering the period 2017/18 to 2019/20. This publication covers academic years 2020/21 to 2022/23.
- 1.3 Using headcount student enrolments, the student population is broken down for on-campus students, excluding Edinburgh Business School (EBS) which holds data separately. We will be undertaking work to include EBS in future student data.
- 1.4 The University also gathers and reports on retention and attainment of our students which is contained under separate cover. We are taking steps to explore further integration of all student related information linked to protected characteristics for reporting, monitoring and information purposes.
- **1.5** Using headcount student enrolments, the student population is broken down as follows for on-campus students (excluding EBS MBA, pre-MBA and DBA students):
 - Gender, Age, Ethnicity and Disability data is collected at all campuses.
 - The additional protected characteristics of Religion or Belief, Sexual
 Orientation and Trans identity/history are not collected at the campuses in
 Dubai and Malaysia.
- 2. Enrolment Headcount by Campus & Level (snapshots taken early in the calendar years 2021, 2022, 2023)
- 2.1. The number of students enrolled at the Dubai campus (Dub), Malaysia campus (Mal) and all Scottish campuses (Sco), by academic year and level of study (foundation, undergraduate (UG), postgraduate taught (PGT) and postgraduate research (PGR)). Numbers are rounded to the nearest 5 or indicated as less than 5 where applicable.
- **2.2.** Those included in the left-hand part of the table are considered "standard" students. All "non-standard" students are included to the right, with reasons for their exclusion from the "standard" population. Throughout this report, the "standard" population is used unless otherwise stated.

The categories previously and currently available for Heriot-Watt students to select are based on HESA's lists below, with the addition of a Malay category, reflecting the University's campus in Malaysia.
- In the tables by campus which follow, categories are aggregated where applicable, e.g. where the proportions for individual ethnicity categories would be too small for individual inclusion.
