Desktop Library.**



EXPORTING FROM SCIEDIRECT

- On the right-hand menu, click on 'Bibliographic information' and then 'Export citation' :



- From the 'Export citation' options, select 'RIS format' and click 'Export' and this will save the citation to your computer:

To export the selected citation + link, select your preferred formats and click Export.








EXPORTING FROM SPRINGERLINK

- On the right-hand menu, under 'Other actions', select 'Export citations':




- From the 'Select Download' drop-down list, select 'EndNote (RIS)' and this will save the citation to your computer:





- You will see the option to 'Download Citation':




- Select 'EndNote, ProCite, RefMan' and this will save the citation to your computer:




IMPORTING TO ENDNOTE WEB

Option 1

- Open EndNote Web
- From the 'Collect' tab, select 'Import Reference':



- Click on '**Choose File**'
You need to locate where you saved your exported file from IEEEExplore. If you did not select a folder, it is probably saved in your 'Downloads' folder
- From the '**Import Option:**' drop down list, select '**RefMan RIS**':




- From the '**To:**' drop down list, select the folder you want to import it to, or create a new folder. You should then get confirmation that your reference has been imported.

Option 2

- When you click to open the downloaded citation, you will be prompted to enter your ENW username/password:



- Once logged-in, you should then get confirmation that your reference has been saved:



- By default, this will be saved into your '**[Unfiled]**' folder, so you can then go into EndNote Web and move it to your preferred group/folder.





Download Citation

Download a citation file in RIS format that can be imported by citation management software including EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks and Reference Manager.

Choose format

- RIS (ProCite, Reference Manager) *For EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks, and most other reference management software*
- BibTex *For JabRef, BibDesk, and other BibTeX-specific software*
- RefWorks Direct Export *Export document citations into your Refworks database*
