# **CODE OF PRACTICE FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF MULTI-LOCATION, MULTI-MODE PROGRAMMES**

# Summary

- The University's Code of Practice for the Management of Multi-Location, Multi-Mode **Programmes** was published November 2013.
- 2. The Multi Code comprises four Parts:
  - 1) The Student Experience
  - 2) Management and Assurance of Quality and Standards
  - 3) Management of **Programmes** and **Partnerships**
  - 4) Quality Enhancement
- Each Part comprises an overall Expectation and series of **Principles** with accompanying **Explanations.**
- 4. The Multi Code aims to underpin the key HWU principle of identical academic standards; diversity of learning experiences

# **Purpose**

The University has published its 4-Part Code of Practice for the Management of Multi-Location, Multi-Mode Programmes. The key purposes are:

To assure the academic standards of multi-location, multi-mode programmes

To assure and enhance the quality of the learning experience of students on programmes outwith the UK campuses

To provide a framework which:

- supports current and future international activity
- is as rigorous, secure and open to scrutiny as that in place for UK campus programmes
- safequards academic standards
- helps to manage potential risks, challenges and
- enables the University to meet all Expectations and Practices of the QAA UK Quality Code

### Scope

The Multi Code applies to programmes offered at a UK campus which are also delivered, supported and/or assessed:

- at an Overseas Campus
- through an arrangement with an academic partner
- via independent distance learning
