At its meeting on 16 December 2021, the Court approved modifications to the Ordinances listed below.

The changes to the Ordinances can be summarised as:

ORDINANCE F8: HEAD OF PRIMARY ACADEMIC UNIT

Ordinance F8 was approved on the recommendation of the Senate, the Ordinances and Regulations Committee and the Governance and Nominations Committee. Ordinance F8 has been retitled 'Head of Primary Academic Unit' so as to be in line with the terminology agreed in the Charter in 2019. The Ordinance now includes the statement that 'The title of the Head of Primary Academic Unit will be Executive Dean', which is the University Executive's preferred title for the position. Further minor modifications have also been included for clarity and consistency.

ORDINANCE H1: APPOINTMENT AND APPRAISAL OF THE PRINCIPAL

Ordinance H1 was approved on the recommendation of the Senate, the Ordinances and Regulations Committee and the Governance and Nominations Committee. The changes to Ordinance H1 replicate the changes previously agreed by Court for Ordinance J1 (Appointment of Vice-Principal) with regards to the composition of the Selection Committee and to permit the Selection Committee to award a professorship without the requirement for a separate process. The changes will also ensure that processes are properly aligned with other Ordinances and best practice.
